**NEW PROGRAM!** The CAA is pleased to offer a weekend hands-on workshop in ground stone tool technology as a part of our summer calendar in 2007. Larry Kinsella, an experimental archeologist and accomplished flintknapper, will lead the course. **Program:** Tuition is \$200 for the weekend, and includes room, complimentary, very basic field lunch each day, and instruction. Breakfast & dinner are on your own. Participants will stay at one of the CAA's bunk house style dormitories while in residence; rooms are at minimum double-occupancy. If you have your own tools, please feel free to bring them, but it is not required. Students are welcome to bring their own raw material (granite or basalt are preferred). **SAVE! Participants who enroll in the Flintknapping Workshop may enroll in this workshop for \$175.00.**

**Who May Enroll:** Adults 18+; novices and experienced participants welcome.

**Is This Program Right For Me?:** If you are interested in spending your weekend exploring the world of ground stone tool technology, then yes!

**Enrollment Process:** Complete the Registration Form and return it to the CAA Office along with your 30% deposit or full payment. Upon receipt of a completed Registration Form, we will send you a confirmation letter and a packet of additional information. A course syllabus will be provided upon your arrival. **Please note that your remaining tuition balance is due one week before the program begins.**
